SBAC Testing – Starting May 1st we will begin our Smarter Balanced Assessments for students in grades 3-8. The assessments will be administered one session per day over the next two weeks beginning May 1st through May 12th. These tests are an important measure of what our students have learned this year. Students will be taking these tests on Chromebooks in their classes. It is important to make sure that your child is prepared with a good night's sleep, a healthy breakfast and arrives at school on time. Tuolumne County Bicycle Rodeo – The California Highway Patrol and Tuolumne County Health Department will host a Countywide Bicycle Rodeo on Saturday, April; 29 form 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.at the Sonora CDJR lot, 13411 Mono Way, Sonora, California.
