# 3. REPORTS

3.1. Superintendent Report

Superintendent Hennes congratulated Rose Wingo on being elected to the Tuolumne County Board of Education.

He wished the board and the audience a wonderful Thanksgiving break.

The concrete steps have been completed. The process took a bit longer than anticipated due to a batch of bad paint.

The contractor has been lined up for the band room renovation.

Mitch McAllister has been on campus. He is our architect for the modernization project. If the funding is approved, the district would pay 40% and the state would pay 60%. The cafeteria needs some work that will include: installing new flooring in the kitchen area, dropping the ceiling, replacing some roof tiles, possibly covering the windows with some overlay, sanding and staining the wood in the breezeway and replacing the swamp cooler in the kitchen.

The district is also required to get a mechanical lift for the state. Hopefully that will be completed by next summer. He said our chances of meeting the money deadline are very good.

He said that in phase 2 modernization, the floor will be replaced in the office and new carpet and all of the wood painted and stained.

Dual pane windows and new sinks in the classrooms will also be added to the list.

# 3.2. Board Member Reports

Member Hoffman-Brady said that his 18 year old son started a construction job in Modesto. He said without the help of the wonderful Mrs. Olsen and the rest of the Twain Harte staff, his son wouldn't have been able to complete 9 years and graduate with honors or be where he is today without the support that he received at Twain Harte School.

# 3.3. Principal Report

Principal Wingo presented the student of the month, Or Yam Bisset.

He reviewed the CAASPP test scores. He said results were very positive. He is working with the teachers to improve math scores. He shared that Twain Harte compared favorably to other districts in the county. Twain Harte improved in ELA. There was a slight decline in math.

Principal Wingo said the Site Council members have been discussing and reviewing the safety plan to see if any changes need to be made.

He ended by saying that the teachers, students and staff have been great with the current transportation challenges.

# 3.4. Staff Reports

Mrs. Hartwig shared that the 5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade had to reschedule their Sacramento field trip due to poor air quality.

Mrs. Hartwig and Mrs. Gold have Emily Hartle coming in to do Spanish with their students.

The primary grades are writing letters to Santa.

Mrs. Carlson and Mrs. Dahlin attended an amazing Math conference in Modesto a few Saturday's ago and have been teaching one of the units from the conference. They are also going to a play at the Gallo Center in Modesto on December 7, 2018. They are excited about decorating the bus for the Christmas parade also.

Mrs. Ballard held her Games with Grown Ups, which included STEM projects for the students to do with their parents.

Mrs. DeMars shared that the 4<sup>th</sup> grade was impressed with the quality of engagement that the 8<sup>th</sup> graders provided for the Halloween Carnival. The 8<sup>th</sup> graders did a wonderful job.

The 4<sup>th</sup> grade class just finished Amal Unbound and absolutely loved the book. They Skyped with several classes throughout the GRA & have continued to use a video app called Flipgrid to connect with the 4<sup>th</sup> grade class in Iowa to discuss the book.

On Friday, November 9<sup>th</sup>, to celebrate the learning about the Pakistani culture throughout the Global Read Aloud. The 4<sup>th</sup> grade had a taste of different foods and drinks from Pakistan that parents helped make. They also listened to music from Pakistan while

eating.

Mrs. DeMars' class went on a field trip to the New Melones Visitor Center. They learned a lot about ecosystems, the natural species of plants & animals of the Woodland environment, and enjoyed visiting the local history museum. Ranger Mike and Ranger Josh did a wonderful job planning the event. Denise Bengard did a phenomenal job getting the 4<sup>th</sup> graders there and back and Mrs. DeMars appreciated her help through the
