3.1. Superintendent Report, Superintendent Hennes

Superintendent Hennes gave the board and audience a tour of the new and improved band room.

He also spoke about the facilities project that is still at the state level. He explained that the project probably will not move forward until next year.

He spoke about the donation for athletics from the Shawn Usrey Memorial Fund. The district is very appreciative and will send a thank you note. Principal Wingo will send a picture of the girls' volleyball team with the new uniforms that the donation helped to purchase.

Nancy Carlson introduced Reed Bruggeman as the student of the month for March, 2019. She said that Reed is an exemplary student and every teacher wishes they could clone a student like Reed.

3.3. Principal Report

Principal Wingo said that Sacramento County Office of Education was on campus last week to provide math support instruction for Mrs. Bickely, Mrs. Broveleit, and Mr. Brown. The feedback received was very good from the teachers. They said she was very helpful and informative.

Lastly, he mentioned that Twain Harte and Jamestown are still looking for a shared band/music teacher.

3.4. Staff Reports

Mrs. Stapp said that kindergarten has 22 chicken eggs in the incubator. Hatching should begin around the April 24th.

Kindergarten through 3rd grade have been enjoying music every Monday for 40 minutes with Mrs. Newman. She brings instruments and sings, and the students have even made a few of their own instruments to play. This is offered through the STEAM grant.

The 3rd grade planted daffodils this year, and they are in full bloom.

The 1st grade, has just finished publishing their class book on opinion writing through Student Treasures Publishing Company. The content of their book includes student opinions on numerous topics and is complete with illustrations, book cover, dedication page, and an "About the Authors" page. They are very excited about becoming published authors.

They are currently working on narrative writing using more details, adjectives, descriptive language, and dialogue.

In math, they have mastered basic geometric shapes and properties. They are now learning how to read analog and digital clocks, identifying and writing the correct time. Additionally, they continue working hard passing our Zearn math missions. Quite a few students are working on Zearn at home.

Mrs. Dahlin is one of four primary teachers that are taking a Mindset math class through the county office, which she says is fabulous. Some of it is online through Stanford and they are learning about project based learning that's hands-on and engaging.

Ms. Bannwarth shared that 4th grade is going to the Crocker Museum in Sacramento on April 16th.

The 4th and 5th grade have been working with Stacy Hay on mono printing and how to use a printing press as part of the STEAM grant.

Mrs. Hartwig, Mrs. Dahlin, Ms. Berry, Mrs. Ballard, Mrs. DeMars and Mrs. Bickley are participating in the STEM Grant sponsored by TCSOS.

Mrs. Bickley, Mrs. Dahlin, Mr. Brown and Mrs. Ballard have completed the first phase for Mathematical Mindset.

ASB has planned their end of the year events. There will be a dance on the 26th, the Fun Run on May 1st and Field Day on May 31st. Staff vs. 8th grade volleyball game on May 30th and the 8th grade will be going to Great America for their graduation field trip on May 24th. The 8th grade tea will be on May 3rd.
