4.4 Staff Reports: Janette Herrera

- TK/K: ABC balloon count down is underway. The class successfully hatched some baby chicks and are observing the movement of worms and ladybugs. They will be taking a field trip to the Post Office to mail Mother's Day gifts.
- 1st Grade: The class observed the life cycle of Painted Lady butterflies and is looking forward to the WOW museum trip.
- 2nd Grade: The class is reading Tall Tales and working on 3-digit addition and subtraction. They are also excited to be going to the WOW museum next week.
- 3rd Grade: The class is doing an amazing job with multiplication, at the start of the year the class was at 11% fluency and are now at 80%, very impressive. They are excited to be heading to Pine Mountain Lake this week and then to Mercer Caverns.
- 7th Grade: Congratulations to our Robotics Team; Christopher Garcia, Dylan Blackmore and Coach Cablayan! Twain Harte took 1st place at the County competition. Their autonomous robot earned 590 points out of 600. Awesome job!

4.5 Special Education/Student Discipline Report-Ladd Brunner, Amanda McLeod, Janette Herrera:

- TK-3 Special Ed, Janette Herrera: Our program is designed for classroom push-in for academic support, and pull-out to work on foundational skills. This year we are also supporting students with behavior intervention. Again the program focuses on classroom push-in support with minimal pull-out for any additional support. Thank you to our teacher's for being open to suggestions on how best to set up our Special Ed. Students for success in the classroom.
- This year I also coached our 3rd and 4th grade Nature Bowl team, half of which were students we work with in Special Ed. program. Congratulations to us, Twain Harte brought home the win! It was a great experience not just for students but for our parents who were very supportive of their students and the team.
- 4-6 Special Ed, Amanda McLeod: Our program is primarily push in with pull-out as needed. Our exceptional team of paraprofessionals allow us to keep our Special Ed. students integrated in the classroom. Also, our general education staff and students are very supportive and inclusive making sure these students are included in daily activities. The combination of all these things along with our ability to be flexible with different strategies that are tailored to each student allows us to successfully keep the student's in our program in their classrooms.
- 7-8 Special Ed, Ladd Brunner: This program is a push-in program. Any one on one support is handled in a tutoring like session. By working with our Special Ed. students in the classroom we ensure they are ready for the transition to the High School environment.
- Discipline, Ladd Brunner: Numbers this year are mixed. We have seen an increase in referrals for bullying and inappropriate acts/gestures/language but we have seen a decrease in physical altercations and suspensions. We believe the increase in referrals may be due to increased supervision during recess and lunch not necessarily an actual increase in the behaviors. We continue to promote the importance of being a good citizen with our Character Counts program which is incentivized by awarding good behavior with character cards. Students are then given awards and recognition at our monthly assemblies. Our program focuses on getting ahead of behavior problems by setting high expectations for appropriate behavior in and out of the classroom. Our amazing emotional support staff, Liz Bryun, School Psychologist, Lisa Berg, Student Support Specialist and Jasmine Rathmel, Social/Emotional Support, play a huge role in supporting the emotional needs of our students.
